

Footnotes and Bibliography

1. Books

Author's name, *Title of Book*, Edition (Place of publication: Publisher, Year of publication), page number.

- Michael Pollan, *The Omnivore's Dilemma: A Natural History of Four Meals* (New York: Penguin, 2006), pp. 99-100.
- Gabriel García Márquez, *Love in the Time of Cholera*, Edith Grossman (trans.) (London: Cape, 1988), pp. 242-55.

In quotes not immediately following the reference: Pollan, p. 31.

Where there are several references by the same author, add a short title: Pollan, *Omnivore's Dilemma*, p. 31.

In quotes immediately following the reference: *Ibid.*, p. 32.

The corresponding bibliographical entry:

- Pollan, Michael. *The Omnivore's Dilemma: A Natural History of Four Meals*. New York: Penguin, 2006.

For books by three or more authors, in the note, list only the first author, followed by et al.:

- Michael Gibbons et al., *The New Production of Knowledge: The Dynamics of Science and Research in Contemporary Societies* (London: Sage, 1994), pp. 220-221.

In later quotes: Gibbons et al., p. 35.

The corresponding bibliographical entry:

- Michael Gibbons et al., *The New Production of Knowledge: The Dynamics of Science and Research in Contemporary Societies*. London: Sage, 1994.

2. Periodicals

Author's name, "article title," *journal title*, volume number, issue number (Month/season Year), page numbers.

- Joshua I. Weinstein, "The Market in Plato's Republic," *Classical Philology*, no. 104 (2009), p. 440.

The corresponding bibliographical entry:

- Weinstein, Joshua I. "The Market in Plato's Republic." *Classical Philology*. no. 104 (2009), pp. 439-458.

3. Articles in a Newspaper or Popular Magazine

N.B. Cited only in footnotes, not in the references/bibliography. Example:

- Ellen Barry, "Insisting on Assad's Exit Will Cost More Lives, Russian Says," *The New York Times*, 29/12/2012.

4. Electronic Resources

When quoting electronic resources on websites, please include all the following: Author's name (if available), "The article or report title," *series name* (if available), website's name, date of publication (if available), accessed on 9/8/2016, at: <http://www...>

The full link to the exact page should be included. Please use an URL Shortener (Bitly) or (Google Shortner). Example:
